## EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S LETTER TO OUR COMMUNITY

Dear Friends.

As we reflect on the past year, we are filled with gratitude for the unwavering support of our community and partners. The Foundation has experienced meaningful progress—both in large milestones and in the quieter, strategic work that ensures our continued strength and sustainability into the future.

We know that the longer it takes a student to complete their certificate or degree, the more likely it will be that they incur significant debt. Over the last ten years, the CGCC Foundation has awarded almost \$1.2 million in scholarships. Those funds were awarded to 453 students, and 354 CGCC degrees or certificates were conferred. This fall, the Foundation is pleased to award scholarships to 77 CGCC students for the 2025-26 academic year across a diverse array of academic pathways.

We took deliberate steps to strengthen our board's capacity and diversity. After conducting a board skills inventory, we recruited and are pleased to welcome two outstanding new members: Carmen Myers, Umpqua Bank Branch Manager and CGCC alumna, and Adam Smith, Site Lead for Server Operations at Google and a new member of our community. Their expertise and commitment will be invaluable.

We embarked on a comprehensive strategic planning process that resulted in the updated vision, mission, and guiding principles statements above. This work was done to ensure the Foundation is in alignment with the college's Strategic Plan. With the support of a technical assistance grant from The Ford Family Foundation, we are

working with an experienced consultant to guide our board and staff in executing on the mission via a clear, actionable roadmap for the next three years.


These accomplishments—both the headline-worthy and the quietly crucial—are proof of what is possible when a community comes together with vision, dedication, and heart.

Thank you for being part of this journey with us.



"Getting through the nursing program at CGCC was full of both highs and lows. The toughest moment came at the end of my first year. My friend and I were both on the edge of not passing, and everything hinged on our final exam. I honestly don't think I've ever been more stressed in my life. We buckled down and studied together for eight or nine hours a day, right up until the test. When we both earned A's it was incredibly rewarding. Our hard work paid off, and it felt amazing.

The Foundation Scholarship was life-changing. As the youngest of five siblings, and after losing my dad at age ten, my mom has carried the weight of supporting our family on her own. Every day, I drove 45 minutes just to get to campus, and the costs of gas, car maintenance, and textbooks quickly became overwhelming. Receiving the Foundation Scholarship lifted a huge burden. It meant I could stop worrying about how I'd pay for the next tank of gas or the next required book, and instead pour all my energy into my studies. Because of this support, I was able to complete my degree with little to no debt—a gift that has opened doors for my future and allowed me to focus on becoming the best nurse I can be. I am deeply grateful to all the Foundation donors, and inspired to pay that generosity forward by serving my community with compassion and skill.

Nursing is a family tradition for us. My mom became a nurse after graduating from a community college in 1988, and my grandmother was a nurse too. My grandma passed away during my first year in the program, but I know she'd be proud of what I've accomplished. Following in their footsteps means the world to me."
