
## **Fund Focus: Endowment**

# **Scholarship Update:**

Donations from individuals and organizations as well as from planned gifts provided Columbia Gorge Community College students with more than \$132,000 in scholarships for 2014-15. CGCC Foundation awarded \$81,120 to 44 outstanding CGCC students this fall, with the remainder of the funds being reserved for winter/spring and high school scholarship rounds. For the fall disbursement, the foundation awarded 29 dedicated scholarships. These awards are based on specific socio-demographic, program, or financial need requirements. Nursing student applicants, along with women, benefited greatly from our dedicated scholarships. The foundation awarded the first of many Robert & Annabelle Vogel Nursing Scholarships to CGCC nursing students. Local women's organizations and supporters also provided more than \$11,000 to CGCC women. Caithness Energy generously donated \$10,000 in support of renewable energy technology students.

For all students who wish to pursue a degree or

who are already enrolled at CGCC, the winter/ spring term scholarship application is due at noon, Nov. 20, 2014. Tuition-only scholarships as well as RET and early education and family studies scholarships will be awarded in December.
